Algeria

Enterprise Nationale de Radiodiffusion Sonore

The Enterprise Nationale de Radiodiffusion Sonore (ENRS, the National Sound Broadcasting Company, Algerian Radio, or Radio Algérienne) is Algeria's state-owned public radio broadcasting organisation. Formed in 1986 when the previous Algerian Radio and Television company (established in 1962) was split into four enterprises, it produces three national radio channels: Chaîne 1 in Arabic, Chaîne 2 in Berber and Chaîne 3 in French. There are also two thematic channels (Radio Culture and Radio Coran), one international station and many local stations.

Radio Algérienne Chaîne 1

Chaîne 1 is the main Arabic language service of Radio Algérienne. Its programming consists of news, information and sport. It currently operates around the clock on two mediumwave transmitters on 909 kHz (10 kW) and 1071 kHz (5 kW). Chaîne 1 news is also relayed by many local stations throughout the day and overnight.

Radio Algérienne Chaîne 2

Chaîne 2 is the Tamazight (Berber) language service of Radio Algérienne. It can be heard on 981 kHz

Radio Algérienne Chaîne 3

Chaîne 3 is the French language service of Radio Algérienne. Its main frequency is longwave 252 kHz but may be relayed by local stations on mediumwave at certain times.

Radio UFC / Radio Culture / Radio Coran

Radio UFC, Radio Culture and Radio Coran are three thematic services of Radio Algérienne. They broadcast mainly on FM, with Radio Coran aired overnight between 2300-0600 on most local mediumwave stations. Other services from Radio Algérienne may also be rebroadcast at various times.

Jil FM

Jil FM, or "Generation FM", is the country's first youth-oriented station. Its main frequency is 94.7 FM but it also broadcasts on 549 kHz mediumwave (on 19 February 2021, Jil FM on 531 kHz, 600 kW, switched to carrying Radio Algérie Internationale). Jil FM programmes are mainly in Arabic, but also has content in French and Tamazight.

Radio Algérienne local radio stations

Local stations generally have their own programmes between 0800-1900 and may relay one of the national channels or Radio Algérie Internationale during the evening. Many stations carry Radio Coran between 2300-0600. The main news bulletins in Arabic from Chaîne 1 may also be aired at 0600, 1200, 1800 and 2200 UTC.

Radio Algeria International

Radio Algeria International is aired on three MW transmitters in Algeria and may also be carried on local stations at certain times. Please see further details below.

Radio Algeria International

Radio Algeria International was launched on 19 March 2007. Broadcasting in four languages, namely Arabic, French, English and Spanish, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, it focuses its programmes on topical national and international news, and the English segment at least also has a daily feature programme. Radio Algeria International is aired on three MW transmitters in Algeria and may also be carried on local stations at certain times.

This was the schedule originally monitored Rihards Millers and Tony Rogers in February 2024 and updated with random observations in June 2025. This was not a definitive schedule and further monitoring was required.

National Radio of the Sahrawi Arab Democratic Republic

National Radio of the Sahrawi Arab Democratic Republic is operated by the Polisario Front in support of independence for Western Sahara. The transmitter is located in Algeria at the Sahrawi refugee camp in Rabouni, close to the south-western town of Tindouf, near the border with Western Sahara. A shortwave transmitter that used to operate in parallel has not been heard for several years now.

Angola

Rádio Nacional de Angola

RNA is the official state-operated radio station with headquarters in Luanda. RNA operates five radio stations in the capital (Canal A, Rádio N'Gola Yetu, Rádio Luanda, Rádio Estéreo FM, Rádio 5), eighteen regional stations (one per province) and an international radio station (International Service)

RNA Canal A

Canal A is the national service of RNA, broadcasting exclusively in Portuguese throughout Angola on a network of FM transmitters. It has also been reported on mediumwave (recently reported as 1135.3 kHz), but the shortwave transmitter (4950v kHz) is now inactive. It airs two comprehensive news bulletins at 1300 and 2000 local time (1200 and 1900 UTC).

Rádio N'gola Yetu or RNA International Channel?

The service on 945 kHz from Angola is subject to confirmation. Some reports indicate it is Rádio N'gola Yetu, which broadcasts in the 14 national languages of Angola, whilst others indicate RNA's International Channel with programmes around the clock in Portuguese, English, French and Lingala. The two services had in the past shared airtime on this mediumwave transmitter (see below), but observations in the past 2-3 years seemed to indicate either one or the other.

The RNA website continues to show "Canal Internacional" between 2100-0000 (which would be 2000-2300 UTC), with Rádio N'gola Yetu at all other times, although it is unclear if this relates to 945 kHz or even if the information is up-to-date.

RNA provincial radio stations on mediumwave

The two most recent stations believed to be operating on mediumwave were Emissora Provincial do Zaire (Rádio Zaire), Soyo, on 1290 kHz and Emissora Provincial do Moxico (Rádio Moxico), Luena, on 1458 kHz, but it is unclear if they are still operating on mediumwave. The Facebook pages of both stations only refer to FM frequencies.

All other provincial radio stations that had operated on MW and/or SW in the past moved to FM several years ago.

Ascension Island

There are no mediumwave stations currently on air on Ascension Island. BBC Radio Ascension on 1485 kHz and Volcano Radio on 1602 had both switched off their mediumwave transmitters by the end of 2009.

Benin

TWR West Africa Transmitter Station (WATS)

TWR's West Africa Transmitting Station went on air on 1 February 2008 and now broadcasts Christian programming to West Africa on two mediumwave transmitters. The original transmitter at Parakou on 1566 kHz (100 kW) covers a large portion of West Africa. The second transmitter on 1476 kHz (200 kW) was inaugurated on 1 February 2020 for broadcasts to Nigeria, as well as parts of the neighboring countries of Cameroon, Benin and Niger. Programmes are in six languages widely spoken across the region: Yoruba, Igbo, Fulani, Hausa, Kanuri and African English,

Botswana

Radio Botswana

Radio Botswana is the public broadcasting service of Botswana. RB1 operates on mediumwave

These appear to be the only MW transmitters left on air in Botswana. Monitoring using online SDR's in Africa do not seem to show any others. The powers may now be considerably less than stated in some cases.

USAGM Botswana Transmitting Station

The USAGM Botswana Transmitting Station is located at Moepeng Hill, near Bobonong, a town in the Central District, 80 km from Selibe Phikwe town. It opened in 1991 and operated on 909 kHz until March 2025 when it was closed following President Donald Trump's decision to reduce the USAGM. At that time it relayed Voice of America programmes to Southern Africa, including Studio 7 to Zimbabwe.

Burkina Faso

Radiodiffusion-Télévision du Burkina

Radiodiffusion-Télévision du Burkina (RTB) is the public television and radio company of Burkina Faso. Radio Burkina is the main national radio channel. There are no mediumwave stations on air in Burkina Faso.

Burundi

Radio-Télévision Nationale du Burundi

Radio-Télévision Nationale du Burundi (RTNB) is a public service audiovisual group under the supervision of the Ministry of Communication of Burundi. There are no mediumwave stations on air in Burundi.

Cameroon

Cameroon Radio Television

Cameroon Radio Television (CRTV) is the state broadcasting service in Cameroon. CRTV is made up of a national radio channel and ten regional stations. There are no mediumwave stations on air in Cameroon.

Canary Islands

Radio Nacional de España (RNE)

Radio Nacional de España (acronym RNE, branded rne, lit. transl. "National Radio of Spain") is the national state-owned public service radio broadcaster in Spain. RNE is the radio division and Televisión Española (TVE) is the television division of Radiotelevisión Española (RTVE), the public corporation which has the overall responsibility for the national broadcasting public services under a Parliament-appointed president.

RNE operates five national radio services, of which two were heard on mediumwave until the end of 2025, Radio Nacional (Radio 1) and Radio 5. The transmitters were then switched off for both services. These include RNE Radio Nacional on 576 kHz Las Palmas de Gran Canaria and 621 kHz Santa Cruz de Tenerife, and RNE Radio 5 on 720 kHz Santa Cruz de Tenerife and 747 kHz Las Palmas de Gran Canaria.

COPE

COPE, an acronym for Cadena de Ondas Populares Españolas, formerly called Radio Popular, is a conventional general radio station, while maintaining programmes with religious content.

SER - Radio Club Tenerife

La Cadena SER (the SER Network) is Spain's premier radio network in terms of both seniority (it was created in 1924) and audience share (it had a regular listenership in 2018 of 4,139,000). The acronym SER stands for Sociedad Española de Radiodifusión (Spanish Broadcasting Company).

Cape Verde

Radiotelevisão Caboverdiana

Radiotelevisão Caboverdiana is a publicly owned company and enterprise, located in the Capeverdean capital city of Praia. The radio channel is branded as RCV. There are no mediumwave stations on air in Cape Verde.

Central African Republic

Radio Centrafrique

Radio Centrafrique is the national public radio station of the Central African Republic. It has been broadcasting since 1958. It is placed under the supervision of the Ministry of Communication and Reconciliation. It has not been reported on mediumwave (1440 kHz) since at least 2012.

Ceuta

Radiolé Costa del Estracho

Radiolé Costa del Estracho includes locally produced programmes and a relay of the Radiolé network.

Chad

Radiodiffusion Nationale Tchadienne

Radiodiffusion Nationale Tchadienne (RNT) (English: Chadian National Radio) is the state-operated national radio broadcaster of Chad and part of L'Office national des médias audiovisuels (Onama), established in December 2019 to improve and modernise the media in Chad. There are no mediumwave stations on air in Chad.

Comoros

Office de Radio et Télévision des Comores

Office de Radio et Télévision des Comores (ORTC) is the national broadcasting service of the Comoros. There are no mediumwave stations on air in the Comoros.

Democratic Republic of Congo

Radio-Télévision Nationale Congolaise

Radio Télévision Nationale Congolaise (RTNC) is the government-controlled national broadcaster of the Democratic Republic of the Congo. There are no mediumwave stations currently on air.

Republic of Congo

Radiodiffusion Télévision Congolaise - Radio Congo

Radiodiffusion Télévision Congolaise is the national broadcaster of the Republic of Congo. There are no mediumwave stations on air in Congo.

Djibouti

Radiodiffusion Télévision de Djibouti

RTD is the national broadcaster of Djibouti. Both RTD mediumwave transmitters were reactivated in the second half of 2022 after nearly nine years off air. The last entry for RTD on 1161 and 1539 kHz was in WRTH 2013; from WRTH 2014 they were listed as inactive but expected to return, and from WRTH 2015 it was mentioned that they were still expected to return but from a new site.

USAGM Djibouti Transmitting Station

The USAGM Djibouti Transmitting Station was opened in 2005. It operated on 1431 kHz until March 2025 when it was closed following President Donald Trump's decision to reduce the USAGM. At that time it relayed the Voice of America with programming mostly focused on the Horn of Africa region in Amharic, Oromo, Tigrinya and Somali.

Egypt

National Media Authority

The National Media Authority (NMA) manages the State-owned media in Egypt. It replaced the Egyptian Radio and Television Union (ERTU) established in 1954. The National Media Authority was created in 2014 after the Ministry of Information was abolished and with the proclamation of the new Egyptian Constitution, establishing independent bodies to manage state-owned media in a move to create a public service media sector. The NMA manages State Television, which includes a number of Egyptian ground and satellite channels, State Radio and Nile Radio.

General Programme (Al-Barnameg Al-Aam)

This is the flagship national radio service with content that includes news and current affairs, talk shows and phone-ins, drama, cultural programming, and music. The most widely heard frequency is 819 kHz at Batra with 300 kW.

Holy Quran Radio (Radio Al-Qur'an Al-Karim)

This national Islamic religious service consists of continuous Qur'an recitation, Tafsir (interpretation), religious lectures and sermons. It is said to be one of the most listened-to stations in Egypt. The most widely heard frequency is 864 kHz at Santah with 500 kW covering Egypt and much of the Middle East at night.

Educational Radio

NMA's Educational Radio offers public education support with school curriculum lessons, as well as literacy and public awareness programmes. It broadcasts from Cairo on 558 kHz and may also form part of the daily schedule on other mediumwave frequencies as well.

Middle East Radio (Radio Al-Sharq Al-Awsat)

This is one of the oldest Arabic radio services, founded in 1934, and offers both classic and contemporary Arabic music and light entertainment. It broadcasts on 774 kHz, Abis (400 kW).

Youth & Sports Radio (Al-Shabab wal-Riyada)

This service is Egypt's specialist network for sport and youth-oriented content, comparable in concept to a combined sports radio and youth talk channel. It offers sports coverage and commentary, youth engagement and participation and national cohesion through sport and public debate. Its dedicated mediumwave channel is 711 kHz (Cairo, 100 kW) but it also forms part of the schedule at certain times on other frequencies.

Voice of the Arabs (Sawt Al-Arab)

Voice of the Arabs is a Pan-Arab service founded in 1953 and was one of the most historically influential Arab radio stations. Its reach on mediumwave is very limited nowadays compared to what it was at its peak. It focuses on Arab political affairs, cultural unity programming, music and heritage content. Rihards Millers has been monitoring Voice of the Arabs on 621 kHz and they were last confirmed on-air in mid-September 2025, although further checks are required. They had previously been observed from 0800v to 1200v with the transmitter switched on just before 0800 and closing around 1200, although this varied slightly each day.

Regional & local radio services

Egypt has an extensive regional radio network, many of which historically relied on mediumwave transmitters for wide rural coverage. Content includes local news, regional culture and dialects, and agricultural and community programming.

Equatorial Guinea

Radio Nacional de Guinea Ecuatorial

Radio Nacional de Guinea Ecuatorial (RNGE) is the national broadcaster of Equatorial Guinea. Radio Bata is the RNGE station located on mainland Rio Muni and Radio Malabo is a RTVGE station located on Bioko Island. There are no mediumwave stations on air in Equatorial Guinea.

Eritrea

Eritrean Radio - Voice of the Broad Masses of Eritrea (Dimtsi Hafash)

Dimtsi Hafash is state run and operates two networks with programmes in several languages. Prior to the defeat of the Mengistu regime in Ethiopia in 1991, it had operated as a clandestine radio station supporting the Eritrean People's Liberation Front and other opposition groups.

Eritrean Radio - Programme 1

Languages used for Programme 1 are believed to include Tigrinya, Tigre and Kunama.

Ethiopia

Ethiopian Broadcasting Corporation

The Ethiopian Broadcasting Corporation (Radio Ethiopia) is the state broadcasting service in Ethiopia. In 2015 the EBC authority was established to regulate all broadcasting in the country (radio and television) and to promote the culture and history of the nations, nationalities and people of Ethiopia.

Radio Ethiopia National Service

Radio Ethiopia National Service is the country's official national broadcaster, operated by the Ethiopian Broadcasting Corporation (EBC). Although a recent programme schedule cannot be found, it is likely that most programmes will be in the main languages in Ethiopia: Amharic, Oromo, Somali, and Tigrinya. Regional programmes may be heard until 1700 and include other languages.

I did some research regarding Sudanese MW on a KiwiSDR in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia. All listed sudanese transmitters seemed to be off air, but on 1602 kHz I heard South Kordufan State Radio in vernacular language (highly presumed!) with acceptable signal. Here is the recording: <https://voca.ro/1m5POiela5wN> the station suddenly went off air in the middle of an african style song at 1917 UTC.

At 540 kHz I heard a wobbling carrier under the mix of Radio Kossuth and Radio Kuwait: <https://voca.ro/1aHTbWOZwJ4Z> According this article Radio Nyala (official name: South Darfur State Radio) was re-launched in late 2024 under the affiliation of Rapid Support Forces, but this mentions only 98 FM. <https://www.darfur24.com/en/2024/12/27/nyala-radio-resumes-after-more-than-a-year-and-a-half/>. Nyala Radio is listed on 540 kHz too, but no source about its state. But I read somewhere several years ago that Radio Nyala had a distorted, unstable signal on 540 kHz, so according to this maybe it is active.

South Sudan

South Sudan Broadcasting Corporation

The South Sudan government operates a loosely coordinated network of local radio stations across the country under the umbrella of South Sudan Broadcasting Corporation. These stations broadcast on FM and can only be heard within the vicinity of the town where they are based. Each station in the network produces and broadcasts its own programming. Radio Juba is the flagship station of the SSBC network, but has not been reported on its mediumwave frequency of 693 kHz for a few years now. There are no other mediumwave stations on air in South Sudan.

In January 2022, the government in Togo adopted legal provisions to merge the country's audiovisual media (TVT, Radio Lome, and Radio Kara) into a single entity that will operate as Radio et Television du Togo (RTVT). There are no mediumwave stations on air in Togo.

Atlantic FM

The local radio station on the island is called Atlantic FM. There is no mediumwave broadcasting on Tristan da Cunha.

Radio Tunis - National Channel

Uganda Broadcasting Corporation

The Uganda Broadcasting Corporation (UBC) is the public broadcasting organisation in Uganda. It was founded as a result of the "Uganda Broadcasting Corporation Act, 2004", which merged the operations of Uganda Television (UTV) and Radio Uganda. There are no mediumwave stations on air in Uganda.

Western Sahara

Western Sahara is a disputed and partially Moroccan-occupied territory in the Maghreb region of North Africa, bordered by Morocco to the north, Algeria to the northeast, Mauritania to the east and south, and the Atlantic Ocean to the west.

SNRT Radio Marocaine (Radio Laâyoune)

SNRT Radio Marocaine is the state broadcasting service of Morocco. The Southern Provinces or Moroccan Sahara are the terms used by the Moroccan government for Western Sahara. These two official Moroccan denominations explicitly include all of Western Sahara. The Moroccan government favours "Southern Provinces" for its geographical obviousness. The transmitter at Laâyoune on 711 kHz includes regional programmes from Laâyoune and Dakhla.

ZBC currently has six radio stations, but there are no longer any services operating on mediumwave or shortwave.
